#### Sustainable Stoup? What's that?

Welcome to the latest opportunity in Michigan to highlight locally grown and sustainably raised food! Michigan Envirothon will be hosting the Inaugural Michigan Sustainable Stoup Competition on Sunday, October 25<sup>th</sup>, 2009 in Grand Ledge Michigan.

This will be a statewide cooking contest open to individuals and restaurants in Michigan with a focus on local, sustainably raised foods and it's for a good cause: a fundraiser for the Michigan Envirothon Program.

Envirothon is a non profit statewide environmental competition that gives high school students outdoor, hands on experience with nature, agriculture and the ecology that surrounds it. These are the young adults who will be the next scientists, foresters, wildlife biologists and farmers. Stoup can be a soup or a stew, or even chili, as long as it is cooked in a pot with locally raised food, it can be entered!

What could be better than Sustainable Stoup? A Sustainable Stoup Competition along with a Michigan wine, hard cider and beer tasting! We will have samples from Michigan wineries and breweries and even a few hard cider makers along for the event to give everyone attending the full circle Michigan experience. The goal of this event is to promote sustainable agriculture, farmers markets, backyard or community gardening and Michigan beverages. It will be a tantalizing, tasty competition for the best stoup in Michigan.

Winners will be selected by a panel of guest judges. Attendees will vote for the People's Choice award. Winners will be featured on the Select Michigan and the Michigan Envirothon website and be announced via a press release.

The Temporary Food Service Establishment License Application and the Iquor license will be taken care of by Michigan Envirolton.

#### Ready to compete?

#### Information and Rules for Competitors

Your soup or stew must have at least 75% of its content grown in Michigan or the final processing plant for any ingredients used must be located in Michigan. Other than processing aids or spices, no part of the product content will be from outside of the USA. Water doesn't count, broth does. You do not have to present your recipe, but you do have to provide your list of ingredients in order of quantity, the origin of those ingredients and the address of the licensed kitchen that you used to cook your stew or soup if you are not a restaurant.

There are several categories to compete in and your may enter your stoup in as many as you wish to have considered. The categories are:

- 100% local Organic Allergen Friendly
- Vegetarian Youth (any age up to 18)

#### What you need to know to compete:

- Registration and payment is due by September 25th, 2009.
- The event begins at 1 pm. All stews, soups and chilies must be at 160 F and ready to serve by 12:30 pm.
- Bring a minimum of 5 gallons of stew or soup to serve in 2 oz portions. Two ounce ladles will be provided.
- Bring information and/or signage representing who you are and where you are from.
- The Eaton County health department has given us permission to use crock pots as long as they are not the old enamel type that could chip. By bringing your own chaffing dishes or crock pots we will save on purchasing disposable racks and aluminum pans.

#### Restaurants:

If you are a restaurant we ask that you bring your own chafing dishes to keep your stew or soup hot. You may also use crock pots if you prefer. Individuals:

Stews and soups must be prepared in a licensed kitchen. Please bring enough crock pots to hold five gallons of stoup hot at 160 degrees.



## Why do a chicken workshop?

- Movement across country to become more self supportive
- People are interested but don't know how or have the background
- People pay for hobbies
- People pay for eggs
- It's fun

## Ideas for fundraiser

- Charge for workshop
- Have local votech students, 4H kids or Girl or Boy Scouts build coops for sale
- Offer coops for purchase, along with other chicken equipment at the workshop and advertise availability ahead of time
- Have chicks available to take home at workshop

## Sample agenda topics

- Overview of Chicken Production: From Chicks to Eggs
- Getting started (Breed Information, obtaining chicks, necessary equipment, starting with chick or hatching eggs)
- Chick Issues (basic needs-diseases, vaccinations, feed, etc.)
  - Recommend local small animal vets.
- Adult Chicken issues (molting, egg eating, broodiness, feather picking, rooster competition, how to introduce new chickens, etc.)
- Predator and pest awareness

### Sample agenda continued:

- Eggs (What can we legally do with our eggs, How to safely prep farm fresh eggs for storing and eating)
- Pros and cons of organic, free-range, cage-free, veg fed, etc
- Coop set up, size/capacity, structural options, nesting boxes, roosting spots, yards
- Winter care—artificial light, heating safely, water, etc
- Meat birds: Breeds, Butchering info/options
- Coop Design
