

Stewards of the Land

MICHIGAN WINERIES GROW GREEN WITH MAEAP By lantce Wilford



B eneath the seeming peacefulness of many Michigan vineyards is an abundance of environmental activity. Farmers have long been regarded as stewards of the land. However, their modern role as caretakers has changed, and life at Michigan's vineyards and wineries is under transformation. family has always strived to make the land better and more productive. MAEAP verification lets us know we are doing what we can to manage our farm and our land as best we can."

In addition to robust educational requirements, growers are required to work with trained technicians through local conservation districts to establish environmental goals and address identified risks. Following completion of a form specific risk assessment and implementing any required corrective actions, farmers may request a third-party objective review by the MDA. The MDA verifies that educational and risk assessment requirements. have been met, that the farm is in conformance. with Michigan's Right to Parm Generally Accepted Practices and that the practices in place adequately address environmental risks. The farm is then "serified," and the farmer is eligible to putchase a sign to communicate this outstanding accomplishment to the community and to consumers. To maintain certification, the farmer must attend an educational session. update the farm plan, and be subject to an essite visit every three years.

Growing Christmas trees produces oxygen, cleanses our air and water, and provides animal habitats. It is a natural way of combating the carbon footprint left by the demands of our modern society. You can help too. When you buy a tree at Candy Cane Christmas Tree Farm and bring back the tree tage between April 15-30, we will give you a four-year-old bare-root transplant to plant at your home. It helps make a better world for all of us. You can also opt to purchase one of our living potted trees and plant it outdoors after decorating it for the holidays.

Protecting our precious planet has always been a big priority for us. This is reflected in the way we manage our farm. We do many chores by hand or using battery operated equipment where possible to reduce our carbon footprint in our community. For example, all tree trimming is done with hand tools. All weed control is done with a battery operated micron applicator which directs the micron mist it produces directly on the weeds, using about one guarter the product. We conserve water through drip irrigation, applying it only and directly where necessary. Insect control is mostly done organically using IPM (integrated pest management). In the rare instance where stronger components are needed, we use a backpack sprayer only on the few trees that really need it.



For these reasons and others of a more technical nature, we were awarded two major ecology awards in 2007 and another in 2009. In August 2009, we received industry recognition from the Michigan Christmas Tree Association as an "Environmentally Friendly Farm".



We were the first farm in Oakland County to be certified under the Michigan Agricultural Environmental Assurance Program (MAEAP) sponsored by the Michigan Department of Agriculture. MAEAP is a voluntary program that encourages Michigan farmers to adopt cost effective pollution prevention practices in compliance with state and federal environmental regulations. In this day of spreading development, where the fragile ecosystems are often disturbed, the MAEAP program offers a systematic approach to ensure that everything we do on the farm is friendly to our neighbors and to the environment

We have also been awarded Michigan Farm Bureau's 2007 Award for Proactive Leadership in Ecology Management. This award also recognizes the work we have

done to make Candy Cane Christmas Tree Farm a model of good environmental stewardship in our community.

We can't do this alone. We consider you partners in our endeavor. Without your patronage, we would not be able to provide this wonderful tree sanctuary in our community.

We also thank Michigan Farm Bureau, Michigan Department of Agriculture, Michigan State University, the Michigan Christmas Tree Association and the National Christmas Tree Association for all the expertise they lend us members who are trying to make a difference.


Greenhouse production is key for many commercial growers, especially those in cold climates. With consumers' growing demand for fresh produce year-round, they are becoming more and more essential. But, undercover crops sap a lot of energy, draining both growers' pocketbooks and the environment. In addition, fertilizers, pesticides, petroleum and waste products are potential water pollutants. Today, some state programs and innovative farmers are finding ways to build better greenhouses and develop strategies for production that is both environmentally sensitive and profitable.

Supporting environmentally sound methods



Signage promotes an operation's compliance with voluntary environmental quality assurance efforts.

Lastly, a third-party verification confirms that risks have been appropriately addressed. Verification is repeated every three years.



Growers earning the MAEAP seal of approval have a marketing and funding advantage. The logo, recently made available for promotional use by verified farms, demonstrates good environmental stewardship to consumers, and the designation can bring cost-share incentives, tax credits, low-cost lending and reduced liability insurance premiums from participating companies. It also certifies that applicable Michigan Right-to-Farm practices are in place, providing nuisance liability protection.

MAEAP verification involves an educational workshop and a confidential on-farm risk assessment by a groundwater technician, which identifies potential problems and customized, economically viable solutions.
