- Coordinate with and support districts in the executing local workgroup activity/responsibilities
- Administer federal programs

NRCS (cont.)

- Provide framework for conservation
 planning functions
- Coordination with district boards on conservation plan and practice approvals
- Ensure engagement of conservation districts and discussions of participant specific activity complies with Sections 1619 and Section 1244 provisions protecting confidentiality of records.
- Shared resources with districts/agencies
- Technical standards and assistance

Conservation District Employees

- Promote professional development
- Support and implement conservation district long range and annual plans of operation including local district programs
- Carry out technical assistance, conservation education, and outreach work including conservation planning
- Share resources/tools/techniques

State Associations

- Coordination between districts
- Represent and provide political support for districts/state agency (budgets, etc.)
- Represent districts at the state/territory level
- (in some states) Carry out training of district boards and staff
- (in some states) Manage technical staff on a multi-district basis
- Serve on State Technical Committees
- Unified voice for conservation districts
- Provide nonprofit status benefits

RC&D Councils

- Outreach
- Provide a vehicle for multi-district and landscape scale initiatives
- Carry out conservation planning
- Identify opportunities and build partnerships around local natural resource issues
- Develop programs to bring together new partners and cooperators
- Assist in facilitation at local and regional workshops
 and forums
- Promote a unified voice in promoting conservation and conservation education
- Provide nonprofit status benefits
