A True Partnership Effort – Implementing Conservation Programs in Iowa

- IDALS administers several cost share programs erosion, habitat, and water quality focused - to meet resource concerns on agricultural and urban lands
- lowa has 100 SWCDs that are responsible for assisting with the administration and approval of many state funded conservation projects within each District
- SWCD Responsibilities
 - 1. Select which conservation practices are eligible from a IDALS-maintained list of practices
 - 2. Prioritize conservation practices based on local conservation priorities and resource concerns
 - 3. Set local policies associated with practice prioritization and funding allocation
 - 4. Review, rank and approve conservation project applications and completed practices






















SWCD Priority Policies – How Districts Prioritize Conservation Funds

- Primary ranking and prioritization scenarios included:
























SWCD Prioritization and Ranking by the Numbers

District use of the 9 most common scenarios used in SWCD policies
























IDALS Review and District Resource Guide

- IDALS staff review District policies and share aggregate district data to SWCDs
- Summary data is shared so that SWCDs are aware of what others are doing, including:
 - Priority System
 - First come, first served
 - Prioritization of conservation practices
 - Ranking of applications based on practices, field, and applicant information
 - District material and practice estimates
 - Summary of District policies
- Encourage policy conversations to facilitate better representation and implementation of local conservation priorities
