Oklahoma State Cost-Share Program

- ◆ Est. in 1998
- ◆ Utilized by 84 conservation Districts in the state of Oklahoma.
- ◆ Technical Assistance is provided by the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS)
- ◆ As of 2020, \$22.5 million has been paid out to participants.
- ◆ \$2.2 million in the last 9 months

Conservation Practices



- 25 offered practices
- Option to pay up to 85% or no more than \$7,500.00
- All practices must meet NRCS standards and be certified by an NRCS Technician
- Districts may request additional practices based on need
