District Directors – Oklahoma Basics

84 conservation districts

Governing body of each conservation district is a district board

Each district board is made up of 5 district directors

84 conservation districts x 5 district directors = 420 individuals (not counting associate directors)

No statutory or rule authority to require directors to complete ANY continuing education/training – everything is voluntary

OACD Leadership Class

Organized and led by the Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts

Work in conjunction with a variety of partners to deliver the program

A statewide educational conservation focused leadership development program

One class each “year”
(current class will graduate in May 2023)

Participating directors complete several classes pertaining to conservation in Oklahoma



Sessions

Each session is spread over two days.

1. District Management & Operation, History of Conservation, & the Legislative Process
2. Water Quality
3. Upstream Flood Control & Cost-Share Programs
4. Soil Health & Conservation Planning
5. Conservation Partnership, Land Reclamation & Erosion, Diversity/Equity/Inclusion



Upon completion of the program, participants will officially “graduate”

Admissions

Interested directors must apply; district board must agree

Must be currently serving or an associate director

Preference is given to newer serving directors

Classes are limited to 20 participants

Structure

Each class is 2 days – beginning mid-morning day 1, ending by mid-afternoon day 2

Lodging and meal costs are covered by OACD

Travel and time away from home are participants only expenses

Conservation districts with participating directors often cover mileage

All sessions include a mix of “classroom” time + hands-on activities in the field

Additional time is also given during each session to explore and learn solo

- Capitol visit to tour the building and view the chamber in session
- Tour of the Oklahoma History Center
- Visit to the Cherokee Nation Heirloom Garden & Native Plant Site
- Tour of the Chickasaw Cultural Center
