



The most pressing resource issue in your county



- "Dust Bowl"
- Act 217 Pennsylvania's Soil Conservation
  District Act (adopted in May 1945)
- Unique:
  - "Community-Based," "Locally Led," "Grassroots"
  - Defined, by law, as political subdivisions of State Government

- 66 PA Conservation Districts(every county except Philadelphia)
- staff range: 1 part-time employeeto22 full-time employees
- 1 50% part of the county - 50% independent districts
- annual budget range: \$30,000 to \$1,500,000+



#### I Act 217

Pennsylvania's Soil Conservation District Act –adopted in May 1945

- Pennsylvania Conservation Districts are subdivisions of State Government
- Section 9 Powers of ConservationDistricts

- to the character of soil erosion and the preventive control measures needed ...
- the operations of the district ... and provide adequate and necessary insurance coverage for directors and employees ...
- Carry out preventative & control measures on any lands ... with written consent ...

- Cooperate or enter into agreements with, and to furnish financial aid to any agency ... in carrying on erosion control and prevention operations ...
- ... <u>to acquire</u> by purchase, exchange, lease, gift, grant, bequest, devise or otherwise, any <u>property</u> ... or interests therein
- Make available ... material or equipment as will assist the effective conservation and utilization of soil resources; and for the prevention and control of soil erosion.

- Construct, improve, and maintain such structures as may be necessary...
- Assist and advise owners and occupiers of land in developing and/or implementing plans for storm water management, water use, water management and water pollution control, soil erosion control and conservation of water and soil resources ....
- Conduct educational programs relating to soil and water conservation ...

- Assist and advise county and municipal governments in subdivision and land development reviews, ... storm water management plans, ... flood plain management, ... water pollution control and other natural resource concerns
- § Accept ... any authority delegated by municipal or county governments, the Commonwealth or Federal Government

- § Sue and to be sued in the name of the district, ... to make and execute contracts ...
- § ... the board of directors may <u>require contributions</u> in money, services, materials or otherwise ...
- § Accept contributions of any character from any source whatsoever ...

- § (Exempt from) provisions with respect to the acquisition, operation or disposition of property by other public bodies
- § Sponsor projects under the Watershed Protection and Flood Prevention Act (PL 566), the Resource Conservation and Development Act, and the Food and Agriculture Act of 1962, as amended.

- § Enter public or private property to make such inspections as are necessary to determine compliance to the extent that such authority has been delegated to a district by the department
- § Establish a program of assistance to <u>environmental</u> advisory councils



## Cooperation



As each goose flaps its wings, it creates an "uplift" for the birds that follow. By flying in a "V" formation, the whole flock adds 71% greater flying range than if each bird flew alone.

### Interdependence




When the lead bird tires, it rotates back into the formation to take advantage of the lifting power of the bird immediately in front of it.

## Encouragement

The geese flying in formation honk to encourage those up front to keep up their speed.

#### **Teamwork**



It pays to take turns doing the hard tasks and sharing leadership.

As with geese, people rely on each others' skills, capabilities, and unique arrangements of gifts, talents, or resources.
